Webster in the Path of Total Eclipse!

Where will you be when Webster looks up?

Mark your calendars because a celestial event of a lifetime is heading our way! On April 8, Western New Yorkers will have the incredible opportunity to witness a total solar eclipse. This is no ordinary event – it is a momentous spectacle that offers both educational and awe-inspiring experiences for people of all ages, especially our students. This is truly a once in a lifetime opportunity as the last solar eclipse that Rochester was able to view in totality was in 1925 and the next will be in 120 years on October 26, 2144!

A solar eclipse occurs when the moon passes between the Earth and the sun, casting a shadow on our planet. During a total solar eclipse, the moon completely covers the sun, turning day into night for a few minutes. The sky darkens, temperatures drop, and the sun's corona (its outer atmosphere) becomes visible. It's a breathtaking sight and a testament to the precision of our solar system.

The eclipse will happen gradually between 2:00 and 4:30 p.m., but the sun will be completely obstructed by the moon for almost four minutes.

Caution needs to be exercised during an eclipse as the sun's rays can damage your eyes. In order to be safe, eclipse glasses, or viewers, need to be used. These are NOT regular sunglasses but are thousands of times darker. Please remember, DO NOT LOOK DIRECT-LY AT THE SUN without the aid of eclipse glasses.


Prior to the eclipse, you may want to choose a viewing location. Look for an area that has clear sightlines to the south and southwest. Trees and buildings will block your view. Consider your yard or an open field in one of Webster's numerous parks. Totality will occur at approximately 3:20 p.m., so preview your location at that time. As a note for planning, the area has the potential for hundreds of thousands of visitors! Traffic may be congested with so many travelers.
