Rain date – Wednesday, June 26, time TBD.

Both ceremonies will last roughly two hours. No tickets are required. These are open seating events. Gates open to the public approximately one hour before each procession begins. There is ample seating for families and other quests in the stands and on the field.

First at State SkillsUSA

Eastern Monroe Career Center had 37 students compete at the New York State SkillsUSA competition, held April 24-26 at the New York State Fairgrounds in Syracuse. Seven of those students took first place and one placed third. Among the first place finishers was **Julia S.**, a senior at Webster Schroeder High School, who finished first in Nail Technology Model.



At the statewide SkillsUSA, students competed in areas ranging from cosmetology and aesthetics to collision repair and construction electricity and more. Congratulations to the 2024 Oak Tree Award winners: **Jeff Darling** and **Carolyn Stahl**! The award, presented annually by the Webster Teachers Association (WTA) and the Webster Central PTSA, recognizes excellence in teaching in the district at the elementary and secondary levels. Each was surprised with the announcement at their respective schools on April 24.

Stahl, the secondary level recipient, is an English teacher at Webster Thomas High School. She is a 25-year veteran educator in the district and currently teaches grades 9 and

12. Darling, the elementary level recipient, is an instructional specialist at Plank Road North Elementary School. He has also taught fourth grade, fifth grade, and has been an enrichment specialist in his 17 years in the district.



Ferruzza Honored as Winningest Webster Athlete

Webster Schroeder High School senior **Sarah F.** has been honored as the winningest varsity athlete to ever grace the halls of Webster's high school - be that at Webster Schroeder, Webster Thomas, or Webster High.

No other boy or girl, from any Webster school, has accomplished what she has. A three-sport athlete, she has won state championships in volleyball



(setter), basketball, and softball (catcher). And on May 9, she was a part of the girls softball team's victory over Fairport, giving Sarah win 179. She received a commemorative plaque in front of teammates, family, friends, and fans.

In the 12 separate varsity seasons she has played - between volleyball, basketball, and softball - Ferruzza's numbers are impressive. Her 179 wins have since been extended as the softball girls again seek a state title. In 2023 hoops, the Warriors ended the season 25-1 as they won the NYS Class AA championship. In 2022, the softball team finished with 22 wins during their Class A state championship run. In 2024, Ferruzza's volleyball team won the Class AA state title finishing the season with 21 wins.

"Tonight, we had the opportunity to honor an all-time great... throughout 12 Varsity seasons and 3 State Championships, Sarah sits at the top in Wins of ANY WARRIOR EVER. Read that again," **Shawn Strege**, director of physical education, athletics and health for the Warriors, tweeted that evening. "Tonight was 179. Happy to recognize her wins but more proud of the person she is."

Sarah will be pursuing a degree in nursing at Nazareth College, where she will also be a member of the Golden Flyers softball team.
