Webster CSD fourth grader **Nicholas (Nico) F,** arrived at Plank Road South Elementary School in style with a little help from his West Webster Fire Department (WWFD) friends. Nico enjoyed a fire truck ride to school on November 16 as WWFD helped celebrate him as a Do the Right Thing Award recipient.

West Webster Fire Chief Brian Kelly nominated Nico for the Rochester Police Department's Do the Right Thing Award following his heroic actions. Last year, WWFD responded to Nico's house after a report of a possible fire. Nico woke up his parents and siblings when he smelled smoke and was able to safely get everyone out of the house before the fire department's arrival.

Rochester Police Department's Do The Right Thing program is designed to seek out the outstanding youth of our community who have distinguished themselves as a role model for their peers. They achieve this status by committing random acts of kindness or by simply doing the right thing. Nico was further recognized by the Rochester Police Department during a ceremony also held the morning of November 16.

As we approach the beginning of the winter season, we find ourselves reflecting on the first few months of the 2023-24 school year. During this season of gratitude, all of us at Webster CSD remain thankful for our community and your ongoing support of our extraordinary students and staff.

We wanted to take this opportunity to thank all community members who exercised their right to vote on Wednesday, October 11, regarding the district's proposed capital improvement project, Building Our Future. The proposed project passed with a 66% approval rate (1,626 yes votes and 829 no votes). Building Our Future is highlighted by safety and security upgrades, roofing, and improvements to interior and exterior building spaces, including the expansion of the One Webster Learning Center (OWL) special education program at Willink Middle School. As the project moves forward, we will provide updates to our community.

The fall sports season was an exciting one with many of our teams celebrating Section V championships – and beyond! 
Parents/guardians who pick their student(s) up from school, please note that the pick-up window will be different on December 22 only. Please consult your school newsletter/notifications for details.

Webster CSD is surveying our One Webster community to forecast student enrollment for the foreseeable future. The annual young child census launched on the district website December 1. If you have children residing in your household who are ages birth to 5 years old, please visit websterschools.org to complete this brief census. Don't delay! The census closes January 6, 2024. Families who do not have access to a computer may participate by calling Student Registration at (585) 216-0029.

Completing the census is a young families' first connection with the school district. It enables us to keep in contact with families as their children approach school age.



Kindergarten Registration to Open January 29

The start of the 2024-25 school year may seem far away, but for families of incoming kindergartners, registration is right around the corner!

Families with a child who will be 5 years old on or before December 1, 2024, that child is eligible for kindergarten enrollment for

the upcoming school year. Kindergarten registration will open Monday, January 29, 2024.* As the date approaches, please check the district website, websterschools.org/ registration, for complete details.

*If a building reaches capacity, families who register during the week of January 29 will be given first priority. Once capacity is met, students will be enrolled in an alternate Webster elementary school.

Pre-K Lottery Opens February 14

Interested in Webster CSD's prekindergarten program? Families with a child who will be 4 years old on or before December 1, 2024, but who are not eligible for kindergarten, that child is eligible for prekindergarten enrollment for the upcoming school year. Together Including Every Student (TIES) is a Webster CSD program that can help support a student with special needs attend an after school activity or community event with a trained peer volunteer (students in grades 8-12). This provides support allowing the participant to feel included amongst peers their own age.
