

District Partners with WHEN for Navigating the Tween Years Series

Webster CSD and Webster Health and Education Network: A Coalition for a Drug Free Community (WHEN:DFCC) have partnered to offer a free series for families of tweens.

Navigating the Tween Years is an interactive forum discussing the rise of anxiety and mental health challenges in kids and how parents/guardians, teachers, and other adults can bolster kids' resilience.

The series kicked off on October 16 with an evening of community coffee and conversation on the topic "Social Media and Your Kids". Presenters included: **Joe Montemaro**, Webster CSD Director of Educational Technology and Information/Communications; **Dana Buccieri**, WHEN member and a retired Webster CSD school counselor now in private practice; and **Dustin Bailey**, WHEN member, Webster CSD Unified bowling coach, and Young Life representative. Together, they led dis-

Two more sessions are in the works:

- "From Worries to Wellness: Building resilience in a stressful world" on Tuesday, January 21; and
- "Empowering Your Family: Harness the power of protective factors" on Wednesday, April 30.

Both of these take place 6:30-8:00 p.m. in the Professional Development Center at Spry Middle School, 119 South Avenue, Webster. You don't need to have attended the first session to attend one or both of the remaining sessions. We hope to see you there!

Students to be Dismissed Early December 20

Families of students attending Webster CSD schools, please note that on Friday, December 20, students will be dismissed early as the district conducts an Emergency Preparedness Early Release Drill required by the New York State Education Department to test the district's plan for the early dismissal of students.

Parents/guardians are notified in advance of the drill so they may be prepared for their students to be dismissed early and arrive home by bus early on December 20. Please note the times listed below are the bus departure times effective for Friday, December 20, 2024 only. Students will be dismissed 10 minutes prior to departure: Schroeder, 3:15 p.m. departure; Thomas, 3:15 p.m. departure; Spry, 3:15 p.m. departure; Willink, 3:15 p.m. departure; **DeWitt**, 2:10 p.m. departure; **Klem** North, 1:50 p.m. departure; Klem South, 2:00 p.m. departure; Plank North, 1:50 p.m. departure; Plank South, 2:10 p.m. departure; Schlegel, 2:10 p.m. departure; State, 2:10 p.m. departure; OWL Elementary, 1:50 p.m. departure; and OWL Middle & High, 2:50 departure.

Parents/guardians who pick their student(s) up from school, please note that the pick-up window will be different on December 20 only. Consult your school newsletter/notifications for details.

Deadline Established for Non-public School Transportation

Families residing in Webster CSD who will be sending their child(ren) to private, parochial, or charter schools in the 2024-25 school year must fill out the annual transportation application.

All students must first be registered with Webster CSD to request transportation. To register your child, please go online to websterschools.org/registration. Any change of address must also be done through Webster CSD Student Registration before transportation can be changed. Residents new to Webster CSD have 30 days from the day they move into the district to fulfill the requirements for transportation.

New York State Education Law requires that transportation be provided to district residents who attend non-public schools within 15 miles of their home, using the shortest, year-round route available to measure this distance. Per NYS Education Law, forms must be received no later than *April 1* of the preceding school year. A separate form must be submitted for each child. Once your child is registered for the school year, go to websterschools.org/transportation > Forms > Private, Parochial, Charter School Transportation to fill out the required transportation form. 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PreK Lottery Opens February 14

Webster CSD offers a comprehensive prekindergarten program. Families with a child who will be 4 years old on or before December 1, 2025, but who are not eligible for kindergarten, that child is eligible for prekindergarten enrollment for the upcoming school year. Lottery applications for the 2025-26 school year will be available February 14-March 14. Learn more at websterschools. org/prek.

Weather Closings

Webster CSD families are reminded that if weather prohibits students from attending school or necessitates closing school early, this information will be communicated as soon as it is available using the district's ParentSquare system. For this reason, parents/guardians need to make sure their contact information is up-to-date with their child(ren)'s school(s). Parents/guardians can do this in one of three ways:

- 1. Contact the main office of each of their child(ren)'s school(s) and provide the correct information.
- 2. Go to websterschools.org, select the Parent & Student Portal button, log in to Infinite Campus and update contact information there.
- 3. Go to websterschools.org, select the ParentSquare button, log in and update contact information there.

Closing information is also provided on the district website (websterschools.org), on district social media (@WebsterCentralSchools on Facebook and @WCSDProud on X), and to local television and radio stations.

When school is closed due to weather, all aquatics, community education, and evening classes and activities are canceled as well. WonderCare may be an exception; please consult their website (websterschools.org/wondercare) and social media (Facebook.com/WonderCare and X @wondercarewcsd).



Census to Help District Plan for Enrollment

Families of young children residing in Webster CSD are being asked to take a brief survey that will be used to forecast student enrollment for the foreseeable future.

The annual young child census launched on the district website on December 1. Parents/guardians with children residing in their household

who are ages birth to 5 years old, please visit websterschools.org to complete this brief census. Don't delay! The census closes January 6, 2025. Families who do not have access to a computer may participate by calling Webster CSD Student Registration at (585) 216-0029.

Completing the census is a young families' first connection with the school district. It enables us to keep in contact with families as their children approach school age.

Kindergarten Registration Opens January 27

The start of the 2025-26 school year may seem far away, but for families of incoming kindergartners, registration is right around the corner!

Families with a child who will be 5 years old on or before December 1, 2025, that child is eligible for kindergarten enrollment for the upcoming school year. Kindergarten registration will open Monday, January 27, 2025. As the date approaches, please check the district website, websterschools.org/registration, for complete details.

Please note that prompt registration is important because if a building reaches capacity, families who register during the week of January 27 will be given first priority. Once capacity is met, students will be enrolled in an alternate Webster CSD elementary school.
