<u>Protocol in the Event of School Closings; Early Dismissal Due to Inclement Weather</u>

Webster CSD families are reminded that if weather prohibits students from attending school or necessitates closing school early, this information will be communicated as soon as it is available using the district's ParentSquare system. Information will also be provided on the district website (websterschools.org), on district social media, and to local television and radio stations. When school is closed due to weather, all aquatics, community education, and evening classes and activities are canceled as well. WonderCare may be an exception; please consult their website, www.websterschools.org/wondercare.

Should the district need to dismiss early, bus riders will return home in the same order as a regular school day. Parents are asked to be prepared with a plan in the event of an early dismissal and discuss it with their children.

Weather conditions vary widely across the district. Parents/guardians are the final authority in deciding whether or not to send a child to school. Weather related absences are legal absences; however, parents are required to notify schools if their children will not be attending.

Families of Young Children Asked to Take Census:

Families of young children residing in Webster CSD are being asked to take a brief survey that will be used to forecast student enrollment for the foreseeable future.

Parents/guardians with children residing in their household who are ages birth to 5 years old, please complete the annual <u>young child census</u>. Don't delay! The census closes January 6, 2025. Families who do not have access to a computer may participate by calling Student Registration at (585) 216-0029.

Completing the census is a young families' first connection with the school district. It enables us to keep in contact with families as their children approach school age. When families share their email address with Webster CSD through the census, it enables the district to notify those families when their children are eligible for prekindergarten and kindergarten registration.

Kindergarten Registration Opens January 27

The start of the 2025-26 school year may seem far away, but for families of incoming kindergarteners, registration is right around the corner!

Families with a child who will be 5 years old on or before December 1, 2025, that child is eligible for kindergarten enrollment for the upcoming school year. Kindergarten registration will open Monday, January 27, 1995. As the date approaches, please check the district website, websterschools.org/registration, for complete details.

Please note that prompt registration is important because if a building reaches capacity, families who register during the week of January 27 will be given first priority. Once capacity is met, students will be enrolled in an alternative Webster CSD elementary school.

PreK Lottery Opens February 14

Webster CSD offers a comprehensive prekindergarten program. Families with a child who will be 4 years old on or before December 1, 2025, but who are not eligible to kindergarten, that child is eligible for prekindergarten enrollment for the upcoming school year. Lottery applications for the 2025-26 school year will be available February 14-March 14. Learn more at www.websterschools.org/prek.

Music "Notes"

As the second marking period draws to a close at the end of January, parents of 1st and 2nd graders will be able to see how their child is progressing in music class. (3rd, 4th and 5th graders will receive their grades for music class at the end of the school year. Kindergarteners do not receive a grade for music.) A variety of aspects and skills are assessed and reported at this time. Here are the areas that are assessed for each student using the "I can" statements:

Artistic Literacy
I can demonstrate my knowledge of musical concepts.
I can utilize my singing voice with accuracy.
I can play instruments with accuracy.
I can persevere in the process of music learning.

As you can see, music class is not just about singing fun, cute songs. Since many of these aspects are skills based, most of the assessing goes on during music class within the context of a game or whole-class activity. Any written quizzes or tests are carefully planned and prepared for in music class.

Grading musical skills at the elementary age is particularly challenging because the development happens at a unique time for each child. Sometimes it even happens overnight! A student who has not "found" their singing voice may all of a sudden come to class the next day singing right on pitch. So, if your child receives a lower grade on their report card, please realize that that is very likely to change as they continue to work towards achieving the standards.


