ELA, Math, plus a combination of science and social studies

Advanced diplomas require- LOTE and additional math and science exams (last year this was 69% of our graduates)

How many electives can I take?

- *Incoming 9th graders can choose 1-2 electives beyond their core classes in one of the following areas: (6.5 - 7.5 Course Load)*
 - *Art*
 - *Business*
 - *Music*
 - *Technology*
 - *ELA (public speaking or journalism)*
 - *Computer Science (including WTI Computer Center)*

*Typically, students complete their 1 credit of fine arts requirement in 9th grade.
This requirement is met through art, music or technology courses.*

Seize the Opportunity

- **It is a process and the plan changes over time.**
 - Take time to explore the [course description](#) book online.
 - Engage in continual conversations as the academic journey develops.
- **Keep doors open.**
 - Seize the opportunity to experience a variety of courses and interests.
- **Don't give up when things get tough. Learning how to learn is part of the process.**

Healthy Balance

- First semester course load is 6.5 credits
- Consider your child's extracurricular activities and commitments outside of school.
- All Freshmen will have a full block study hall plus a ½ block study hall first semester
- What if my child is recommended for Enriched or AP Prep courses? (consider strengths, interests, workload etc.)
- Choose a Healthy Balance that allows for your child to challenge themselves and not feel overloaded!

The Math Question

- Students enrolled in algebra in 8th grade are considered accelerated.
- Entering 9th grade you may take geometry or geometry enriched.
- *What's the difference???*

Geometry

- Accelerated course for 9th graders
- Normal progression
 - 10th grade-Algebra 2
 - 11th grade- Precalculus
(MCC Dual Enrollment)
 - 12th grade- AP Calculus AB
(MCC Dual Enrollment)

Geometry Enriched

- Accelerated *AND* Enriched for 9th graders
- Normal Progression
 - 10th- Algebra 2 Enr
 - 11th- Precalculus Enr
(MCC Dual Enrollment)
 - 12th- AP Calculus BC

All the curriculum of Geometry plus considerable enriched material to prepare for AP Calculus BC

- 8th graders in Living Environment are considered accelerated.
- Options for 9th grade:
 - Earth Science
 - Earth Science Enriched
 - For most accelerated students
 - Freshman Physics
 - For accelerated students with stronger math skills

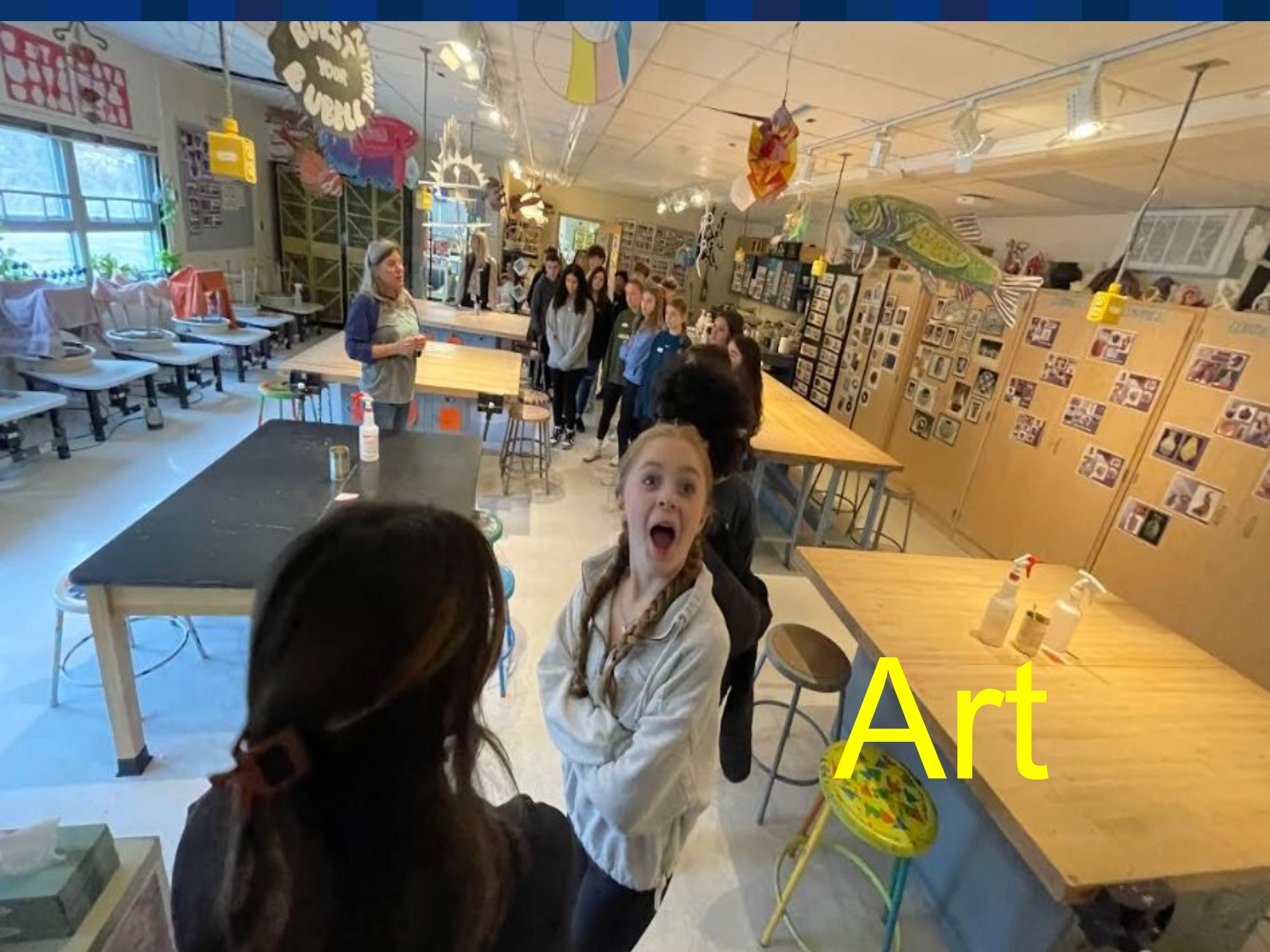
January 9, 10, 11- 8th Grade students will come to Thomas HS in the morning to visit elective classrooms:

April 29- Last day to make changes to your course requests for next school year.

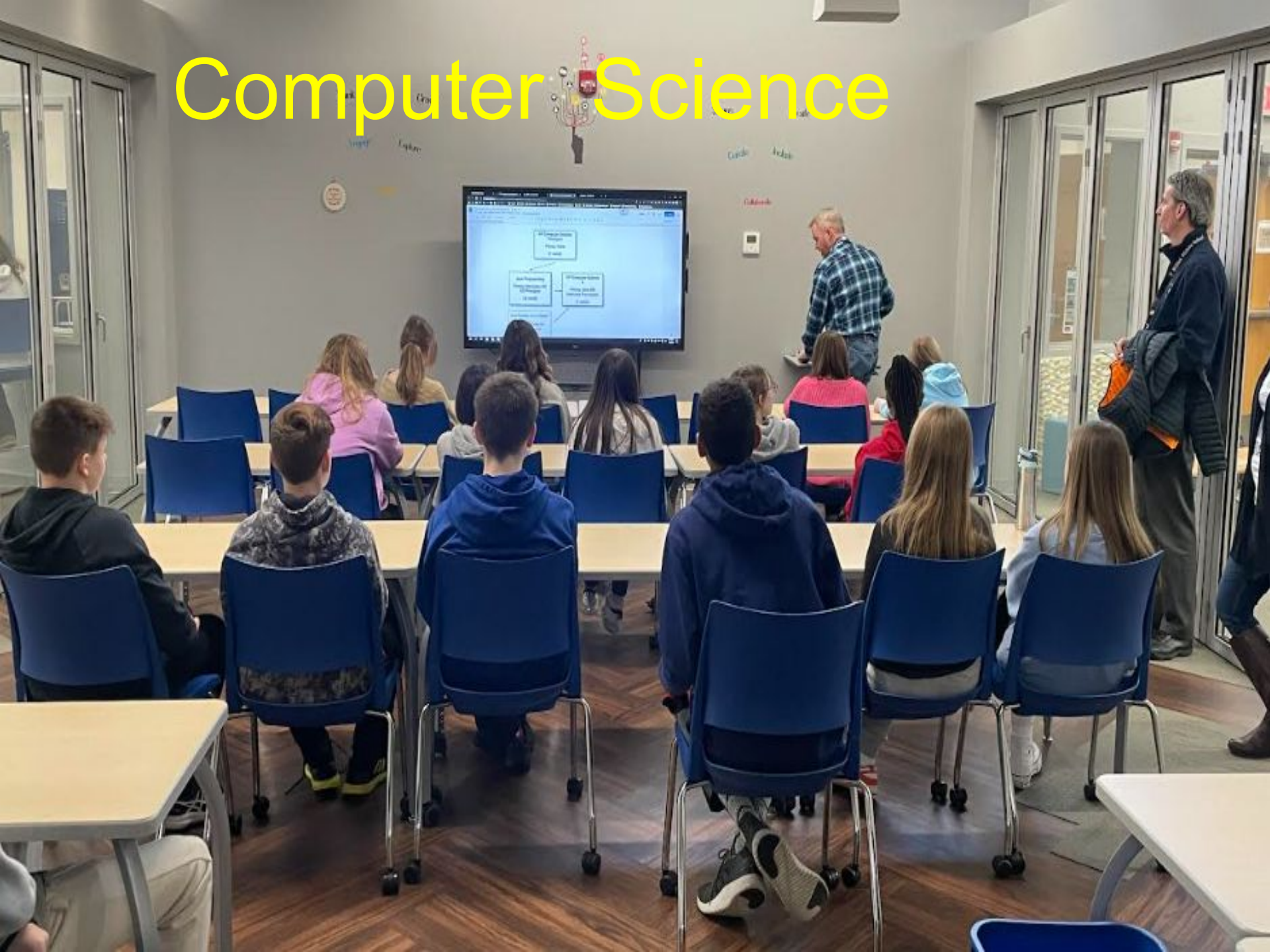
